# What is the youth exchange about?

We want to neutralize the stereotypes and discrimination against immigrants, refugees, asylum seekers by empowering young people with knowledge about their human rights, good practices of inclusion and non-formal activities like visiting a refugee camp, expressing human rights through theatre and making connections around the world.





# What are our objectives?

- Increasing the knowledge of the participants about the current migration crisis around Europe and fundamental principles of human rights
- Empowering the participants to recognize and combat acts of hate speech, discrimination against migrants, refugees, asylum seekers
- To promote human rights and inclusion
- Increasing self-esteem of young people from severely disadvantaged backgrounds using various forms of arts an expression of dialogue such as theatre, creative drama, flashmobs

# Overview & methods

- The youth exchange will be implemented with the attendance of 42 participants from Lithuania, Turkey, Romania, Italy, Germany and Greece.
- During 8 working days, the working methods will be based on non-formal education such as: creative drama techniques, simulation games, team building, various workshops such as dance, music, interacting with local people, intercultural nights, cultural activities and reflections.

# The venue

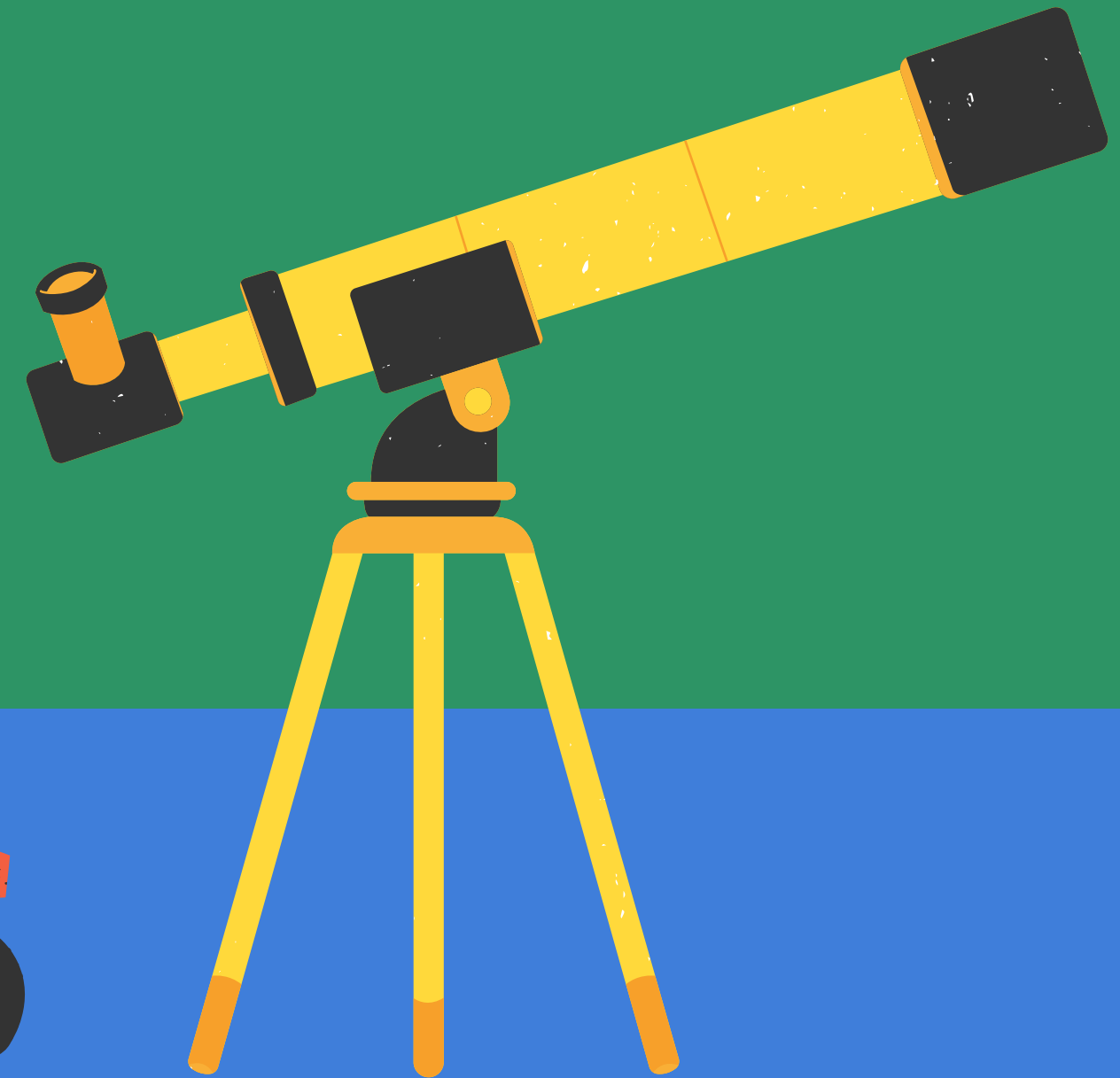
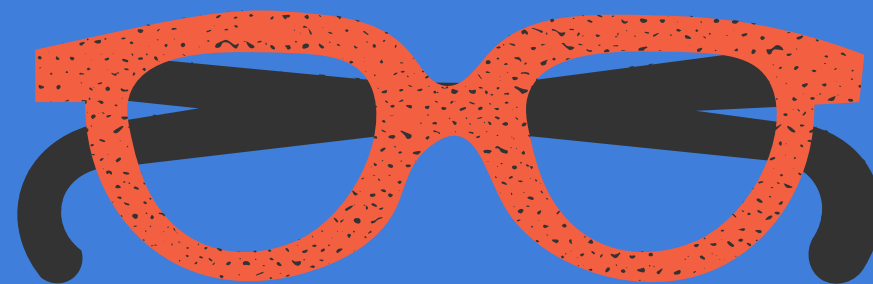
- The event will take place in the hostel Restaurant Carnareasa Brebu near Resita. Participants will be accommodated in rooms for 2-4 people with own bathroom.

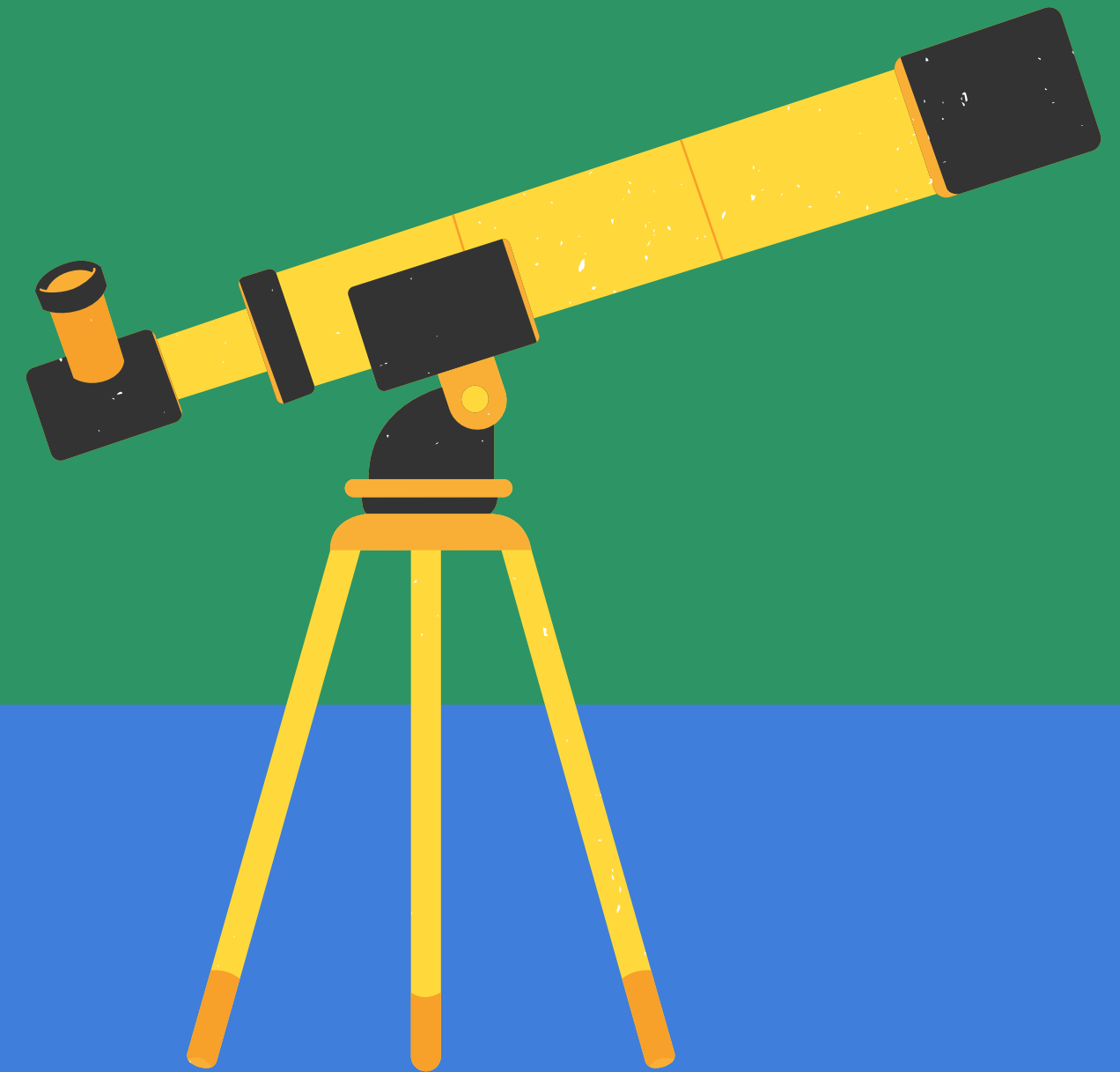
# Travel
